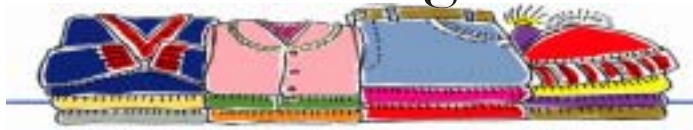

"A new commandment I give to you, that you love one another; as I have loved you, that you also love one another. By this all will know that you are My disciples, if you have love for one another" (John 23:34-35, NKJV). This is a very powerful commandment that Jesus gave. Tonight is the monthly Spanish Visitation Dinner in the Fellowship Hall, after evening services.

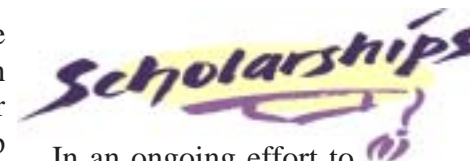

A speaker began his seminar by holding up a \$20 bill. He asked the group of 200, "Who would like this \$20 bill?" Most hands went up.
