We talked about a year ago, when I had just discovered my DEDMON connection, which is through Mark and Hannah's daughter, Sarah who married Abraham PADGETT. Their daughter, Sicily PADGETT married my gg-grandfather, Samuel GREEN. Their son, Joseph Kimsey GREENE was my g-grandfather. His son, Clyde Alexander GREENE was my grandfather and Joseph Clyde GREENE was my father. You helped so much when I was just getting started (and Danny McBee, too). I am still about where I was then, with DEDMON research. You shared so much with me and it was so thorough. One thing is new. The ladies at the local (Rutherford Co., NC) Genealogical Society have been wanting me to join the DAR, because I have several Revolutionay War Ancestors. While looking over each of them, I discovered that I probably already have sufficient documentation to go in through Mark DEDMON's service. I checked with the National DAR and they said that they do not have Mark in their Patriot Index, which is another good reason to use Mark. Because of his service, he really should be listed as a Patriot. I have the following documentation: Mark's Rev. War Pension Application from the National Archives, a record of his pay vouchers from the NC State Archives, Mark and Hannah's marriage bond from the NC State Archives, Marriage bonds for Sarah DEDMON and Abraham PADGETT and for Sicily PADGETT and Samuel GREEN, Family Bible Record of Abraham PADGETT and Sarah DEDMON, and birth, marriage, and/or death certificates for all the others, as well as copies of Census Records, showing family groups. I think I am just about ready to submit it to the local chapter. If I have listed anything here, that you do not have and would like copies, I would be happy to mail them to you. Also, if you are in contact with other DEDMON researchers, please pass along the fact that I do plan to get Mark into the DAR Patriot Index. One other thing I would like to share with you. The old, lost PADGETT family cemetery, where Mark's daughter, Sarah (Dedmon) PADGETT and Abraham PADGETT are buried, has been located and the descendents are in the process of reclaiming it. There are about 80 graves there, most marked with field stones. As a little girl, I can remember going to High Shoals Bapt. Church with my grandfather and father to take flowers on their annual Memorial Day. After visiting there, my grandfather would walk through the woods for about a mile to the old cemetery to visit the graves of Abraham and Sarah. His grandmother, Sicily PADGETT Green had asked him to visit the graves of her parents as long as he was able, which he did, so even though there are no names and dates on their tombstones, I do know for sure that they are there. It has been nice to chat with you again.

The following letters are all from Shanna Franks, I am including them as she wrote them to me. I am sure the information she includes will aid some of you in your research.... This is the kind of response we always look for... Thanks Shana

Dear Sir: I am busy researching my family tree for my grandmother. Her maiden name is Dedmon and she was born and raised in Oklahoma. Her father was Raymond A. Dedmon, and his father was Hansel M. Dedmon. He is unfortunatly as far back as I have gotten. He was born October 14 1876 and died June 7 1962. We believe that Hansel's father was an immigrant from Ireland. I also believe that the spelling then was Dedmond. If you have any information that could help me I would sincerly appreciate it. Thanks so much for your time -Mrs.Franks

Mr Dedmon: Thanks so much for your speedy reply. I support Windows 98 so anything you can send me will be appreciated. Also, I have some new information about Hansel Marcus that you can add to your records. His actual date of birth is October 14 1876, and he died June 7 1962. His wife Ada L. Pearson was born 1880 and died 1958. They both are buried in Monroe, Oklahoma. There is also another child that was not mentioned and his name is Novie Udell Dedmon and he was born about 1922. He is still living and doing well. Raymond Arthur Dedmon was born December 31, 1904 in Oklahoma and he married Annice Menthy Gregory January 4, 1936. They had two children, Melba Kay Dedmon and Mildred Fay Dedmon. Melba was born November 2, 1936 and Mildred was born June 20, 1942. Melba married Earl Benton Barnes September 16, 1952. They had two children Diana Kay Barnes born January 6, 1960 and Tamara Rebecca Barnes born June 22, 1961. Diana married Jack W. Wilson October 11, 1974. They had one child Shana Diane Wilson born June 18, 1975. Shana Diane married Brian Dean Franks July 17, 1992. They have two children. Brandon Shea born December 27, 1994, and Briana Lynn born November 12, 1996. Diana's second marriage was to Donnie Allen Waymire June 18, 1976. They had three children, Alecia Ann born September 26, 1977, Andrea Kay born July 6 1983, Joshua Isaiah born March 1 1989. Alecia Ann married KC Bunn September 21, 1998. Tamara Rebecca married Curtis Eugene Kunze January 21, 1981. They have one son Daniel Curtis Benton Kunze born March 25, 1984. Tamara died July 17, 1996. Mildred Fay Dedmon married Ovil Nay Brand June 21, 1959. They have two children Kimberly Fay born November 12, 1961, and Mark Edward born March 17, 1976. Kimberly Fay married John Albert January 1981. They have one son, John David Albert born April 1983. Mark Edward married Lorrie? July 17, 1998. I hope this new information will help you to put another branch on our tree. I will talk to my grandma tomorrow and she can get some more information about Hansels other childrens families. Dear Mr. Dedmon: I spoke to my grandma this morning and she talked to Novie Udell and he has some different information then you have recorded. He looked these things up in their family bible and these are the corrections. These are the children of Hansel and Ada in order from first to last. 1. Flossie -died at birth August 1899 2. Iva- died at birth March 7, 1901 3. Ona -born Oct 1, 1902 4. Raymond -Dec 30, 1904 5. Herman- March 6, 1907 6. Pearl -Aug 14, 1909 7. Opal- Feb 27, 1916 8. Eva -Oct 7, 1918 9. Novie -Oct 29, 1922 Novie also said that he knows that our branch of the tree is Dutch/German. The Irish I was talking about before is on Ada's side. These are some corrections to the information I gave you yesterday. Mark Edward Brand married Lorrie Macdonald July 17, 1998 John David Albert was born April 26, 1984 Kimberly Fay married John Albert February 7, 1981 Kimberly Fay was born November 12, 1962 Novie is going to send us more information about his wives and child.
