Boot Hill - Tombstone, AR

Those who do family research usually spend some time in cemeteries and searching for obituaries. In looking for epitaphs, I ran across several in boothill, in the famous town of Tombstone, AR. This one caught my eye, "Here lies Lester Moore, Four slugs from a .44, No Les, No more." Lester Moore was purportedly a Wells, Fargo & Co. station agent in the border town of Naco who died in a shootout with Hank Dunstan over a mangled package. There was never anyone named Lester Moore who was killed in Arizona Territory and there is no evidence to indicate where Dunstan (who also died in the purported shootout) was buried. However, there is a find Agrave notation at (Find A Grave Memorial 19899). Although I was unable to locate any of our family members in Boot Hill, does not mean none are there. Although he is not buried in Boot Hill, the first legal hanging in Wasco County, OR was a Deadmond. I wrote about this in Volume 103 of the newsletter. Find Agrave.com lists almost 4,000 fmaily members oi all the varied spellings of our surname. Dedman (1227) and Dedmon (1212) have the most listings with Deadman (595) Deadmond (289) Deadmon (218) Dedmond (94).



Deadman Cemetery

There is a **Deadman Cemetery** in Mocksville, Davie County, North Carolina, Where several of our original ancestors who came to America in the 17th century are buried. My paternal grandmother, along with many other of my ancestors are buried in the **Dedmon Cemetery** in Catoosa County, GA, near Ringgold. 
