We were given a "private" tour of the facility one evening prior to the worship service. The old building is in the middle of the small town of Bismarck and there was no room for expansion or parking. They have plenty of both at the new location.

On the way home we stopped at our son's (Gary) home in Springfield, TN and spent the night. Actually we did that on the way up as well. We were able to eat with our grandsons, Greg and Jonathan and of course Gary and Diane. It is hard to believe that Greg has graduated from High School and Jonathan will be a senior next year. Our "little" boys are not little any more....



Well folks! What can I say! It finally arrived! the big 65 is her. Yep it happened just one mile from where I am now living on June 27, 1939. Although I don't remember it, Mom says that Doc Stevenson slept in his car all night outside our home awaiting my arrival. I am not sure if the twenty-five dollars he charged included overtime charges or not. What a bargain! No comments please.



I am the oldest of five children born to Ruby Dickson and Gordon Dedmon. My sisters, Carolyn and Ruth are next in line and then my brother Tommy was born November 4, 1943. This picture is the earliest I could find of myself. Maybe one year old...

Here is a picture of my mom and dad with me and Carolyn. I am guessing that I am around 2 years old as Carolyn was born January 11,1941 and she appears to be around six months old here. I didn't remember having a pair of overalls until just recently, but I guess I did. Mom thinks the house in the background was where



her mother (Pearl Templeton Dickson Vess) and step-father, Olan Vess were living on Dr. Banks chicken farm in Ryle Springs, TN. I don't remember that egg farm, but I do recall another later that they lived on. Some of my fondest



memories is going with grandpa to gather eggs and then sitting around the stove at night to clean them.

Here I am with my dad somewhere around two years of age. We don't have very many pictures of dad. ...and then there were three... Alma Ruth was born July 24, 1942, thus in three years there were three kids with approximately eighteen months between each of them.... Now I am the "big brother" to my younger sisters. I have fond memories of the "big" yard and cedar tree in Graysville, GA, where we were living by the time I was five years old. It didn't take a "bought" swing set in those days to provide an excellent playground. Just hang a rope

on the nearest limb, give us a couple of sticks, a few rocks and old car tires and we had it made. Pictured here are the three of us, "all dressed up" and ready for church. The story goes, that I was holding Ruth's dress to keep her from walking to the camera and it showed more of her diaper than mom intended.



...now I am four and there are four of us... Tommy was born November 4, 1943. Four children in four years and four months. Now at least there were as many boys as were girls, so I no longer felt "out numbered"... Of course, I don't remember



any thing that we voted on in those days. I guess it is just knowing there are more of them... Here we are somewhere around the ages of seven and three. I suspect by then we had moved to East Garden Farm Rd. in Rossville, GA, where I lived from 1946 until I married in 1959.

Joseph William, (we called him Billy) was born March 1, 1947 about four months before my eighth birthday. He is the only one that I remember when

he was born. Here is the "baby" of the family around four years of age. Even as a young boy he was "out standing in his field". He, Tom and I played countless hours of baseball. Bill currently preaches for the Church of Christ in Bowden, GA, where he also serves the church as an elder.



On May 30th, 2004, my father's side of my family -- the Hightowers -- had our annual family reunion at Still Waters Farm in Bamberg County, South Carolina. The little village is named Govan, S.C. Govan is small but powerful. It gave the world the founder of Vanderbilt University in Nashville, TN. Bishop McTyrie of the Methodist Church. He is buried on the Vanderbilt campus and honored as its founder.

I am attaching a photo which was taken by my double-first cousin once removed, Jean Hightower Maslankowski of Colorado. This was her first visit to our annual reunion. She and her daughter and three of her grandkids were lodged in the log cabin which is located on the Still Waters Farm site. The log cabin is special to many of us. It was the Boy Scout Hut of Troop 77 in Denmark, S.C. That was the troop of which I was a member for years. In fact, when the cypress logs were pulled out of the Edisto River swamps many years ago, I was among the scouts who skinned the cypress logs to be used in building the log meeting house.

Over the many years of usage, the Scout Hut fell into disuse because of the deterioration of the neighborhood in which it was located. Criminals were using it for purposes which were the direct opposite of its original use. And the Scouts were forced to take refuge into the rural area of Denmark for safety. The Scout Hut was finally disassembled and reassembled about 10 miles south in the quiet village of Govan. It is now used as a rental unit at the bed and breakfast Still Waters Farm. Jean's first cousin, Millie Lundy Smoak of Denmark, SC, enjoyed a few visits with Jean and other family members at the Farm. I enjoyed reviewing the history of Denmark, the First Baptist Church, and Ghents Branch Baptist Church, and other Bamberg County places of interest in the comfortable rocking chairs on the front porch of the old log-cabin converted Boy Scout Hut.

This photo was taken on Thanksgiving Eve 2002. My wife and I had been over to Nashville to see Neil Diamond in concert and were hurrying back to S.C. to be with the family on Thanksgiving. This was my first successful attempt to find the Cavender Cemetery. It was my third attempt. Although I had been to the home place before, I had not walked the few yards into the pine forest which hides the headstones. Eddie

Hi Cousin LeRoy,

You have really produced a great newsletter. It is very interesting. It is professional. It was worth printing. It was very much appreciated. I am very pleased with your publishing of my e-mail correspondence with you and also the publishing of the Cavender Family Reunion in 1933 in Villanow at the old Cavender Home place which is also the location of the Cavender Cemetery. There are six marked graves there. The largest headstone is that of Martha Almina "Mattie" Clements Cavender. She was the first wife of Joseph Warren Cavender. She died as a result of the birth of their last born child Joseph W. W. Cavender. The baby was born 2 Nov. 1882 in Villanow, and his mother followed him shortly in death.

My Great-Grandfather Joseph Warren Cavender erected what amounts to a monument to his dear wife which has engravings on all four sides. On one side it has the names of all seven of their children including the first and last who did not survive childhood. Of course, the only son to reach adulthood was my Grandfather Judson Cicero Cavender, who I addressed as "Pa," On another side, it gives the names of her Mother and Father. Her father was Dr. Adam C. Clements and her mother was Mary Wilson Hill Park Clements. Of course, two of the headstone in the Cavender Cemetery are small ones with angels engraved on them and belong to my Great-Aunt and Great-Uncle who died as babies. Two of the headstones belong to Dr. and Mrs. Adam Clements. And the other headstone designates the final resting place of Great-Grandfather Joseph Warren Cavender, who fought on the CSA side of the War of Northern Aggression.

It would not surprise me to learn that you have visited this cemetery since you have lived in that part of the state. I received sad news that the old Cavender home place requires razing soon, if not already. It seems that the portion of the house which was a log cabin which was built by the local Indian who still lived in the area has one wall which in now in such a condition of rot, that demolition is necessary. The house and property is now owned by Llewellyn (Lew) Chapman, Jr. and his sister. They are the Grandchildren of Joseph Warren Cavender's daughter Myrtis. Lew told me that "Bug" Shaw, who is quite an historian, is in charge of the disassembling and will determine how to best use the logs for historic purposes. I would really like to be present to say "good-bye" to the home place which has never had indoor plumbing and only a hand-pump on the back porch. To think so many relatives were born and raised there.

In proof-reading the portion of the newsletter which refers to the Joseph Warren Cavender branch of the family, I was very pleased and did not see anything that needs editing. Thank you so much for treating our branch with such warmth. Eddie Hightower

Thank you Eddie for the contribution you have added to this research project. I did not know about the cemetery until now, but rest assured it is on my "must do" list to make a visit. It is not far from where I live.
